Principal of the College **Dr Kulvinder Kour**, in her inaugural address, said, "education is globally acknowledged as the most powerful means of empowering human. The aim of this conference is to bring out the recent innovation, trends and concerns as well as practical challenges encountered and solutions adopted in the fields of Teaching, Learning and Education".

papers but after careful scrutiny, our team has decided that around 80 papers will be discussed in the conference”.
